

Penalties for Athletic Code Violations

1st Offense	<p>Suspended: 40% of contest dates and must continue to practice and travel with the team but not dress for contest.</p> <p>Alternative: Suspended 20% of contest dates <u>and</u> mandatory 3 counseling sessions. Student must follow the recommendations of the screeners. Parent(s) must attend one of the sessions. Non-compliance of counseling requirements will revert to 40% suspension of contest dates.</p>
2nd Offense	<p>Suspended: 1 calendar year (365 days) from practice and competition. The athlete must complete appropriate substance abuse counseling approved by the School District of Durand before reinstatement.</p> <p>Alternative: 50% of sports season must continue to practice and travel with the team but may not dress for the contest <u>and</u> the athlete must undergo evaluation from a chemical dependency center approved by the School student District of Durand and follow all recommendations of the center. All costs of assessment and treatment are the responsibility of the student/parent. Non-compliance of counseling requirements will revert to 1-year suspension from practice and competition. Also, must serve eight (8) hours of community service to be monitored by the Athletic Director. All community service must be completed before becoming eligible. All academic-related community service must be completed prior to completion of code-related community service. Only community service accumulated after the infraction will be counted.</p>
3rd Offense	<p>Suspended: 1 calendar year (365 days) from practice and competition. The athlete must seek appropriate substance abuse counseling approved by the School District of Durand before reinstatement.</p> <p>Alternative: None</p>
Criminal Offense	An athlete who is charged or convicted of a felony will be ineligible for all participation in WIAA activities until the student has satisfied all of the requirements ordered by the court in declaring a sentence served, including probation, community service, and any other court orders.
Other	Behavior contrary to the ideals, principles, or standards of the school may result in a minimum 1 event suspension as determined by the administration, Athletic Director, or designee.
Note:	<p>> Satisfactory completion of a sports season must be accomplished to regain eligibility status for other sports seasons.</p> <p>> The suspension carries over (by percentage) into the athlete's next season if the suspension cannot be completed during the current season.</p>
